Gathering of Leadership Groups - January 2008

Renewal leadership teams from throughout the country gathered in a show of unity and mutual support January 11-14. Represented were the National Service Committee, Steering Committee for the Association of Diocesan Liaison's as well as representatives from the Hispanic, Haitian, Korean and Filipino streams of the Renewal.

The purpose of these gatherings can be summed up in the "Unity Statement" adopted on February 23, 1995 and revised on January 17, 2001;

"To fulfill our call to bring the grace of Pentecost into the life of all to whom God sends us, we recommit ourselves to appropriate the prayer of Jesus for unity, "May they all be One", by:

- *Responding to the call for deeper unity with Jesus through prayer.*
- *Working for unity in all relationships through repentance, reconciliation and friendship.*
- *Fostering unity with the Church through loyalty and obedience to our Bishops, the Magisterium and the Holy Father, especially in his Pastoral vision for the new millennium, Novo Millennio Ineunte.*

We entrust ourselves and this commitment to Mary, our Mother, and invoke her intercession and that of all the saints to help us remain faithful to this call."

In our Plenary Session we responded by sharing our thoughts on two questions.

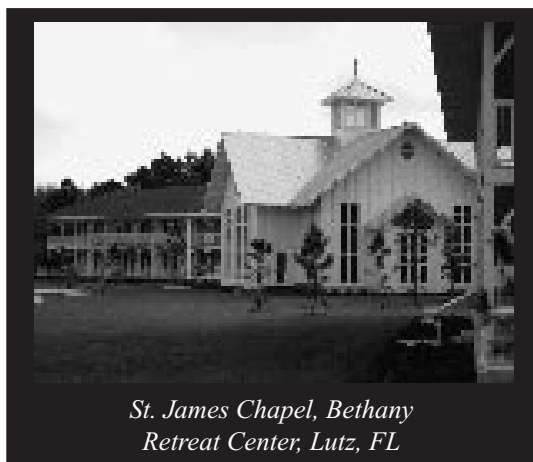
What is the Lord asking leaders to do this year about charisms?

- Hold events on teaching of charisms in our local dioceses.
- Have an interchange on strengths, weaknesses, issues so as to support each other.
- Identify resources.
- Next year bring to the Gathering resources, reports, presentations on what has worked in our area of the Renewal.
- Assign someone to build a questionnaire to assess knowledge and use of charisms and how they are promoted.
- Leaders need to ask for renewal themselves. Many leaders are not using the charisms and seem to lack awareness of their importance in their ministries.

What is the Lord asking leaders to do this year about promoting unity?

- Develop a leadership website with supportive material for all as well as links to the various streams of the Renewal.
- Reach out to Portuguese, Vietnamese, Indian and other streams of the Renewal who haven't been represented at this "Gathering" yet. (Some members agreed to contact some of these groups.)
- More Public relations is needed to promote attendance at the "Gathering".
- Follow up as last year with a "Year of Unity:" with prayer cards and monthly reflections from Chariscenter. (This could also be done with the first question i.e. a "Year of Charisms".)
- Together reaffirm the "Unity Statement" and all sign it at our next "Gathering".

I hope this is helpful information for all of you as you seek to lead the Renewal under the power of the Holy Spirit in your own diocese.
